## Why study at Curtin Singapore?

Curtin Singapore gives students from around the world the opportunity to complete their Curtin University of Technology Postgraduate Business programs in one of the world's most cosmopolitan cities. ## Master of International Business

### Course Description:

This program develops students' global managerial competencies with a focus on business issues relating to the Asia-Pacific region. A highly specialised program for students wanting to develop the skills needed for a successful career in global business environments.

### Entry requirements

Bachelor Degree in Business, Economics or Commerce.

English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 or equivalent.

## Master of Accounting (MAcc)/Professional Accounting (MPA)

### Course Description

The Master of Accounting (3 semester full time study) is a specialised advanced professional accounting course which aims to provide graduates from other disciplines with professional, practical accounting knowledge, analytical skills, related financial management skills, and teaches related legal aspects of business.

### Entry Requirements

MAcc: A bachelor degree, excluding accounting majors, from a recognised tertiary institution.

Students with a 3 to 4 year full time diploma from a recognised degree awarding tertiary institution may be eligible to join the Master of Professional Accounting (MPA) and must complete a 4th semester (4 Subjects).

### Professional Recognition

The MAcc/MPA meets requirements for entry to a number of professional accounting bodies including Certified Practising Accountants Australia (CPAA), the Institute of Chartered Accountants Australia and the ACCA.

## Master of Logistics

### Course Description

Designed for professional logistics specialists who are interested in significantly advancing their career in the area of logistics and supply chain management. Areas of study include: operations management, transportation and physical distribution, procurement, manufacturing, warehousing, inventory, retailing, global business and logistics, and the role of information technology in facilitating supply chain management.

### Entry Requirements

Students are required to complete the Singapore Institute of Materials Management Graduate Diploma in Logistics and Materials Management. Upon completion of the graduate diploma, and meeting required English proficiency, students will be given direct entry into the second year of the Master of Business (Logistics Management). English language proficiency IELTS 6.5 or equivalent.

# Master of Human Resources

## Course Description

Students must successfully complete 12 units over three semesters.

Designed for managers, human resource and industrial relations professionals, and consultants wanting to develop and expand their knowledge, personal and professional skills in complex and changing organisational climates. The course features guided independent study, team projects and maximum use of information and communication technology.

## Entry Requirements

1. A bachelor degree in business, economics or commerce, or an equivalent qualification from a recognised tertiary institution provided the

specific discipline in the bachelor degree is different to that of the proposed professional master, or

2. A bachelor degree in a field other than business, economics or commerce, or an equivalent qualification from a recognised institution, or honours degree, or graduate diploma (in business, economics or commerce), or significant professional experience.
3. English language proficiency IELTS 6.5 or equivalent.
