Admission Information For International Students

The university is pleased to accept applications from international students. Freshman and transfer applicants applying directly from overseas should have outstanding academic qualifications and satisfactory TOEFL scores. Applicants who have completed a bachelor's degree or its equivalent, from an accredited institution, with a strong academic record, and satisfactory TOEFL scores may be considered for admission as graduate students. All foreign students must submit TOEFL scores, unless they have attended for at least three years, full-time, an educational institution at the secondary level or above where English is the principal language of instruction. International students who have completed 72 transferable units at an educational institution where English is the principal language of instruction may request a waiver to the TOEFL requirement by writing to the Admissions Office. Verification of the language of instruction may be required.

International applicants graduating from U.S. high schools are required to submit results from the TOEFL as well as the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT I) or the American College Test (ACT). Graduate applicants may be required to submit scores for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) depending upon their intended field of study. All graduate business administration applicants are required to take the Graduate Management Administration Test (GMAT).

Admitted students will receive a Notice of Admissions from the Office of Admissions. The I-20 and orientation materials will be mailed separately from the Office of International Education and Exchange. How long does the admissions process take?

When the Admissions Office has received all items on the front page, your file will be forwarded to an Admissions Evaluator to be reviewed for admission eligibility. A file will not be forwarded until it is complete. Students should expect to wait 6-8 weeks for an admissions decision.

The university has established guidelines to insure the timely processing of all applications and to enable admitted applicants to make arrangements to reach the U.S. and the campus prior to orientation and registration. **Early completion of your application is important!**

Application Filing Periods

For Fall Semester

Applications are accepted beginning October 1. Applications must be completed with all required documentation as quickly as possible as the closing of majors can occur at any time.

For Spring Semester

Applications are accepted to appropriate majors beginning August 1. Applications must be completed with all required documentation as quickly as possible as the closing of majors can occur at any time.

Academic Records

Original documents of previous school records are required. Applicants should request official transcripts, not copies, to be sent from each educational institution attended. Official documents in languages other than English must include certified English translations by independent agencies. Academic records should include the following information:

- A listing of each course taken with the grade or mark earned. All students from India and Pakistan must provide official copies of yearly mark sheets indicating minimum and maximum marks obtained for each examination completed, beginning with the secondary/intermediate school certificate.
- The number of weeks and number of hours per week spent in lectures or laboratory work for each course.
- The diplomas, degrees or certificates received.

The acceptability of any foreign work and academic placement is determined by the university. Applicants who fail to provide records of all coursework will have their application cancelled or the offer of admission rescinded. In such a case, no refund will be made nor will the documentation submitted be returned.

Additional examination scores may be required for admission to California State University, Fullerton graduate programs. Please refer to the university catalog or website www.catalog.fullerton.edu for information on additional department test requirements.

Non-Resident Student Budget

CSU Fullerton does not have financial aid for foreign students and, therefore, applicants must provide satisfactory evidence that adequate funds are available to meet the financial obligations for the first 12 month of enrollment.

English Test Requirements

Before an application can be considered, all applicants must submit an official score report from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). This examination is administered several times a year in the United States and overseas. The TOEFL results submitted must not have been earned more than two years prior to the desired enrollment date. CSUF will not accept institutional TOEFL scores other than its own. All applicants whose native language is other than English are required to present scores for the TOEFL. Students from India, Pakistan, and the Philippines must submit the results of the TOEFL regardless of the language of instruction.

The I-20 Form

When you have been admitted to Cal State Fullerton, the office of Admissions will mail a Notice of Admission to you. They will also notify the Office of International Education & Exchange of your admission and send your International Student Financial Statement and Affidavit and accompanying financial documents for the review. The I-20 form will be prepared by them and mailed to you after they review the financial documents.

These documents will be reviewed for the following:

- Is the International Student Financial Statement and Affidavit completed properly and signed?
- Does the accompanying bank statement meet the minimum requirement of \$20,060 or equivalent? [note see box on the back of the application for a breakdown of expenses]
- Does the name of the sponsor on the Student Financial Statement and Affidavit match the name of the account holder on the bank statement?
- Is the bank statement dated within the last year?
- Did you provide an English language copy if you submit bank documents from your home country?

If the documents meet the above requirements, your I-20 will be mailed separately to you by U.S. post-international airmail.

If the documents do not meet the above requirements, you will receive an email message or letter informing you of the additional or new documentation required.

The Office of International Education and Exchange

The Office of International Education and Exchange serves Cal State Fullerton's international students. After you are admitted to the University, you will receive detailed information from this office in a "Welcome Letter" together with your I-20. The "Welcome Letter" will provide information about preparing for study at Cal State Fullerton, arrival services, International Student Orientation, leadership development programs, advising, and many other services provided by the Office of International Education and Exchange.

Note: Applicants to Cal State Fullerton who require assistance with change of visa status should indicate this in item 14 of the application form. Applicants may receive follow-up correspondence from the Office of International Education and Exchange regarding visa status or financial documentation. Please do not contact International Education and Exchange until after you have been admitted to the university or have been contacted directly by that office.

Placement Exams in English and Math

All admitted students who wish to enroll in the University and who are not otherwise exempt from the English or Math placement tests must take the exam(s) at the first available scheduled time prior to their registration. Students residing in the United States are encouraged to take the exams by May for the fall or October/November for the spring. Normally, international students who are admitted from overseas must take the exam(s) just prior to the beginning of school. Students must take the placement test(s) and have the test results on campus before they are permitted to register. Please review the Testing Office website for the scheduled test dates. Their website is located at www.fullerton.edu/testing/. Please refer to the sections on the test dates and exemptions under the information provided on the English Placement Test and the Entry Level Math Exam. There are sample test questions provided.

American Language Program

The American Language Program (ALP) available at the university is specifically designed for international students who are academically qualified for admission to California State University, Fullerton, but have insufficient TOEFL scores or need further language preparation to be admitted.
