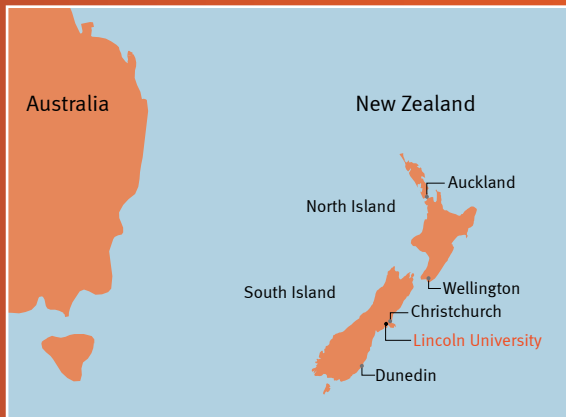

What is Study Abroad?

Study Abroad is a fee paying, modular programme, enabling students to earn credits at Lincoln University in New Zealand, to put towards their degree at their home institute.

Students are able to enrol for one or two semesters on an independent basis, or as part of a Study Abroad programme. A Study Abroad programme can be organised by the home institution, through other universities or through Study Abroad placement organisations.

The programme is available to both undergraduate and postgraduate students, provided Lincoln University's admission requirements are met.



Lincoln University

Lincoln University is one of New Zealand's oldest tertiary education institutions and the only specialist university in New Zealand. Founded in 1878, the University has long been held in high regard for its teaching and research activities.

The University's unique history, combined with more recent contemporary growth in the wider land-based disciplines, means it now occupies a specialist position covering globally-significant areas of learning such as, but not limited to, the rural-urban interface; agribusiness; elements of biology and ecology; land, air and water resources management; production processes; marketing; software and information technology; transformation and use of food; spatial planning and landscape architecture; human wellbeing; and recreation and tourism.

Key Features

- Picturesque and park-like campus with a student population of approximately 4000 representing over 65 different countries
- Quality teaching and excellent staff to student ratio – 1:14 – every student can receive individual attention
- Industry-relevant programmes providing students with the skills and knowledge required to compete successfully in the job market
- Teaching, amenities and accommodation are located on one campus.

Courses

Study Abroad students can choose from any of the courses offered, as long as they have the appropriate academic background for the course they wish to study.

Most courses are taught over one semester. Lincoln University's academic year is divided into two semesters:

Semester One	February to June
Semester Two	July to November

Credits

Study Abroad students are required to study full-time to satisfy Immigration New Zealand requirements. Students will need to study 60 Lincoln University credits per semester:

- For undergraduate students this means choosing four courses per semester, each worth 15 credits
- For postgraduate students this means choosing three courses per semester, each worth 20 credits.

These equate to 30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) or 16 US credits per semester respectively.

Admission Requirements

Study Abroad students need to have a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) score of 2.75. Students with a lower GPA can apply and be assessed on a case-by-case basis. For more information, contact the Study Abroad and Global Mobility Administrator.

English language tests may not be required for selected European Nationals who have been taught in English. Please contact the Study Abroad and Global Mobility Administrator for further information.

Accommodation

Students in the fully-catered Halls of Residence have their own furnished room with shared laundry and bathroom facilities. Students also have the option of self-catered or semi-catered Halls of Residence, or to organise their own accommodation off campus.

A full calendar of social, sporting and cultural events is on offer to help students integrate into university life.
