
NOOSA



STUDYING AT CQUNIVERSITY

STUDY MODES

Our courses are delivered on campus and/or by distance education study modes. You can also undertake a blend of the two study modes provided you meet specific requirements as detailed below.

ON-CAMPUS

If you are in Australia on a student visa you must study full time on campus. Whilst in Australia, you are able to undertake some units within your course by distance education/online provided it is: no more than 25 percent of your entire course; approved by the University; and not entirely by distance education/online in a compulsory term.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

Distance education courses are delivered off campus and only available to international students who do not live in Australia. If you wish to study by distance education, please note that you can study part time or full time; and may be required to attend a residential school in Australia for a short period of time to fulfil the requirements of your course.

Benefits of Distance Education

We offer a wide range of courses completely by distance education. As you are not required to attend regular classes on campus, you will have more flexibility to study at your own pace at home, work or wherever you can access the Internet. Apart from the flexibility, you will also benefit from:

- » Our five star rating for Online/Distance learning (QS Stars™ 2015)
- » Access to advanced online learning technologies and specialist staff
- » Full-time or part-time study load
- » Save over AU\$18 000* per year on living expenses (based on the Department of Immigration and Border Protection's financial requirements).

Specialist Support

We have put in place a network of experienced staff and support services that are available for use at any time from wherever you might be studying. Some of these support services include:

- » electronic library
- » study material provided in hard copy or online
- » access to recorded lectures online and lecturers who guide and support you
- » study groups and online discussion forums
- » weekend or online orientation sessions.

TEACHING METHODS

We use a variety of teaching methods, ranging from face-to-face interactions in lectures, tutorials and study groups, to online delivery of units. Whether you study on campus or by distance education, there will be avenues for interactions with lecturers, tutors and fellow students to enrich your learning experience. You are encouraged to ask questions and express your views during discussions and presentations.

Our small class sizes ensure that you have more one-on-one interaction with your lecturers and tutors who will monitor your academic progress. Assessment may take a variety of forms including written and practical tests, online quizzes, participation in group discussions and final examinations at the end of each term. Some units may involve supervised off-campus work placements which form a large part of the unit's content and assessment.

FULL OR PART-TIME STUDY

For a postgraduate degree, a standard full-time load consists of four units per term. If you live in Australia on a student visa you must study full time for the duration of your course. Part-time study is only available to international students who do not live in Australia. A part-time study load consists of one or two units per term.


THREE TERMS A YEAR

We offer three terms per year, so you can start your courses at the beginning of the year, mid-year or towards the end of the year. Term 3 is not compulsory – it is another study option to provide you with the opportunity to start your study at a time more convenient to you, or to fast-track your study and get into the workforce sooner. The Course Summary section of this guide provides a snapshot of the courses that are available in Term 3.

GLOBAL OPPORTUNITIES

CQUGLOBAL INBOUND PROGRAMS

CQUGlobal is CQUniversity's global mobility program allowing international and domestic students to undertake part of their studies in a different country. CAREER PREPARATION

Our courses are developed alongside industry to ensure that you gain up-to-date and relevant knowledge to prepare you for a seamless entry into the workforce. Many are accredited by professional bodies in Australia and overseas, and contain different forms of work integrated learning including internships, interdisciplinary learning, simulated real-world activities and clinical and industrial placements.

CLINICAL PLACEMENTS

Students studying our health courses are required by accrediting industry bodies to undertake clinical placements. The placements can take place with an external provider with which the University has strong industry links, or for those studying at CQUniversity’s Mackay Ooralea and Rockhampton North campuses, within the on-campus allied health clinics, where they will learn from health professionals and deliver supervised healthcare to students and the local community.

INDUSTRIAL PLACEMENTS

Project or industry based learning is integrated in a number of our engineering courses so that our students are capable of ‘personally conducting and managing an engineering project to achieve a substantial outcome to professional standards’, which is a requirement by Engineers Australia in order for them to be recognised as professional engineers.

SOCIAL INNOVATION

CQUniversity is the first and only university in Australia to date to be recognised as a Changemaker Campus by Ashoka U, an exclusive global social innovation group. Our goal is to equip our students with skills and knowledge, so that they can realise their potential when it comes to creating change. POSTGRADUATE OPTIONS

COURSEWORK

Graduate Certificate

A graduate certificate provides specialised study in a specific subject area, with the opportunity to progress to a graduate diploma and/or masters upon completion. Many CQUniversity graduate certificate courses are designed as a pathway for those who have not studied a bachelor degree, but have relevant professional experience.

Graduate Diploma

Graduate diplomas are designed for those who have already completed a bachelor degree or equivalent, or have significant professional or industry experience in a relevant area. Graduate diplomas enable you to develop skills in a specialised area, or equip you with the knowledge to undertake a new career direction.

Masters by Coursework

Masters by coursework comprises a series of specialist courses designed to extend your professional understanding in a particular subject area, or provide you with the opportunity to move in a new professional direction.

Postgraduate coursework courses have a structure consisting of core and elective units, and therefore require students to enrol in these units, attend timetabled classes and complete required assignments.

RESEARCH HIGHER DEGREES

Masters by Research

A masters by research will enable you to undertake original research in a particular area of interest under supervision and resulting in the submission of a thesis. You may be required to undertake coursework or research skills development studies before commencement as preparation for this type of course.

Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)


Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) may be undertaken in any area in which supervisory expertise and appropriate infrastructure are available. The PhD is awarded on the basis of a thesis prepared under supervision that makes an original, significant and extensive contribution to knowledge and understanding in the relevant field of study, as judged by independent experts applying accepted contemporary international standards.

Doctor of Education

The Doctor of Education is a professionally based research higher degree available through the University as an alternative to the traditional research programs. It offers a rigorous program combining structured advanced research tasks and a thesis component.

Doctor of Professional Studies

The Doctor of Professional Studies is an internationally recognised higher research degree designed to produce innovation in commercial, government, educational and other applied settings. Whereas the PhD, EdD and other 'professional' doctorates are single-discipline based, the CQUniversity Doctor of Professional Studies is explicitly transdisciplinary to reflect the way research is carried out in industry and government.

RESEARCH

CQUniversity engages with regional, national, and international research communities and industry partners to increase research activity and offer outstanding research qualifications for students. We also collaborate with industry, funding agencies, government, regional communities, and other higher education institutions.

Our focus has been to emphasise research with relevance to the region, involving aspects of regional development, growth in resource industries, environmental management, issues associated with quality health care in rural and regional communities, and education delivery specifically through use of modern technology.

EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH

In 2015 we achieved our best-ever ratings in the Commonwealth Government’s periodic assessment of Australian research. The Excellence in Research Australia (ERA) results showed that CQUniversity was conducting research rated as at, above and well above world standards in many areas including Mathematics, Psychology, Nursing, Agriculture and VET Science, Environmental Science, Engineering, Medical & Health Science, Artificial Intelligence, and Public Health and Health Services.



RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

If you have previously studied at another university or institution within the last ten years, or have professional experience, you may be eligible for recognition of prior learning (also known as advanced standing, credit exemption and credit transfer). Recognition of prior learning must be applied for at the time of applying for your course. Your qualifications and professional experience will be assessed on a case by case basis. Confirmation of approved credits will be made when you receive an Offer of Admission.

EXTERNAL PROVIDERS

CQUniversity has partnerships and articulation arrangements with selected external providers. If you already hold an Australian TAFE qualification or equivalent from one of our external providers, you may use your qualification to gain entry into selected courses at CQUniversity.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must meet the minimum academic and English requirements to gain entry into our postgraduate courses. These requirements may vary and your application will be assessed by International Admissions.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

CQUniversity's academic requirements for entry into postgraduate courses for international students vary by discipline. Some courses require previous study in a particular subject area. Relevant work experience may be considered in conjunction with higher education study for some courses. The general academic requirements are summarised below.

If you do not meet the minimum English requirements, you can apply to study one of our English language courses with CQUniversity. 
ALUMNI COMMUNITY

LIVING IN AUSTRALIA

STUDENT VISA AND HEALTH COVER

If you intend to study in Australia, you will require a student visa. As a student visa holder, you are required to have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your studies. If you are under 18 years old, you are also required to have an approved guardian until you turn 18 and reside in a CQUniversity approved accommodation.

As of 1 July 2016, DIBP has made changes to its student visa processes including the introduction of a simplified student visa framework (SSVF). SSVF is a change to the way DIBP assesses your eligibility for a student visa. For more information visit www.cqu.edu.au/studentvisas.

The University requires that you pay for your OSHC when you pay for your tuition fees. This will ensure that you have health cover upon arrival in Australia. The cost of OSHC will depend on the type of cover you need. For more information visit www.oshcallianzassistance.com.au.
