




## Step Inside



# Students receive all the resources needed to compete.

**Excellent Academic Programs:** From writing skills to information technology know-how, Berkeley students are prepared to succeed in life and in the community. Each program offered is developed by experts to ensure that what students learn is relevant in today's workplace.

**English as a Second Language:** English as a Second Language is offered at the New York City Campus. Students who are at a high-intermediate level of ESL have the advantage of taking an appropriate degree-level class along with their ESL classes. This gives students a head start on their Berkeley College degree.

**Computer Training:** Berkeley College supports a 21st Century vision of information technology. Berkeley places great emphasis on digital technology: the systems, applications, programs, and formats used in today's workforce. The college continually maintains and upgrades equipment, programs, and curriculum to stay at the forefront of the industry.

**Libraries:** Each campus has a library that houses an array of print and non-print resources, periodicals, study areas, computers, and audiovisual equipment. Additionally, a systemwide catalog encompasses more than 100,000 items that comprise the contents of all the Berkeley College libraries. The facilities all have their own web pages, providing students with 24/7 access to online catalogs, electronic databases, reference tools, and the Internet.



**Academic Support Centers (ASC):** To help students improve their academic performance and achieve their educational goals, Berkeley has established Academic Support Centers. These facilities provide an array of academic support services such as workshops on study skill techniques and time management. Peer and faculty tutoring are available online and on-site. The tutoring program has been awarded Level I College and Reading Learning Association (CRLA) program certification.

**Student Support Services:** Berkeley College provides each student with a free email account. This provides access to an informational website that links to class schedules, exam dates, and online discussion rooms that can be used for group study sessions and online tutoring.

## International Student Scholarships

Berkeley welcomes international students and appreciates the global perspective that they bring into the college classrooms. To help students achieve their Berkeley education, a number of international student scholarships are available. Scholarships are awarded based on merit and financial need. Students must apply for the scholarship at the same time as they apply for admissions.

## International Student Office

# Academic Programs at Berkeley

**Berkeley's accreditations and approvals:** All Berkeley College campuses are regionally accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. The New York City and Westchester campuses are authorized by the New York State Board of Regents to confer degrees of Bachelor of Business Administration, Bachelor of Science, Associate in Science, and Associate in Applied Science. Berkeley's programs also are registered by the New York State Education Department. The New Jersey campuses are licensed as a college and authorized by the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education to confer the degrees of Bachelor of Science, Associate in Science, and Associate in Applied Science. The American Bar Association (ABA) approves the Paralegal Studies program at all campuses.

**Berkeley's areas of study:** Bachelor's degree (B.B.A. and B.S), Associate's degree (A.A.S. and A.S.), and Certificate programs provide exceptional career preparation and valuable employer marketability. Programs combine leading-edge theory with real-world practicality to engender the skills and knowledge needed for a rewarding future.



## ACCOUNTING (B.B.A., B.S., A.A.S.)

Our degree programs combine accounting theory and practice with a broad background in business administration and the liberal arts, opening many opportunities for students in corporations, government agencies, not-for-profit organizations and private practice.

## BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (B.S.)

This program is an advanced course of study that strategically balances academic preparation, professional training, and hands-on experience. The curriculum emphasizes creative problem-solving; team-building; presentation skills; cultural diversity; cross-cultural communication; forecasting; and strategic planning. Job opportunities can be found in financial services, manufacturing, public utilities, health, education, retail, government, and elsewhere.

## FASHION MARKETING & MANAGEMENT (B.B.A., B.S., A.A.S.)

The degree programs in Fashion Marketing and Management integrate the creative and business aspects of the fashion industry that employers demand. Incorporating marketing strategies and management skills, the programs encompass current technology and a complete understanding of the various segments of the fashion industry. Potential careers include positions in fashion retail management, product development, visual merchandising, buying, allocation and planning.

## FINANCIAL SERVICES (B.B.A., B.S., A.A.S.)

Bachelor's degree programs in Financial Services prepare students for the Certified Financial Planning Examination offered by the CFP Board of Standards, Inc. Trained professionals in this field can assess and evaluate a client's financial future and develop a comprehensive financial plan. The Associate's degree program is designed to provide an overview of financial institutions, the products and services they offer, and their importance to the economy. Potential careers include positions in financial organizations including investment firms and banks.

## GENERAL BUSINESS (B.B.A.)

This degree program broadens business knowledge within the context of personal and career objectives. It offers the opportunity to complement prior learning and extend studies in areas related to specific employment opportunities. Students can build a concentration in more than one specific area of study under the guidance of an academic advisor.

## HEALTH SERVICES MANAGEMENT (B.B.A., B.S.)

The Health Services Management degree programs prepare students to take their place among healthcare professionals. These programs familiarize students with the expanding health services industry and the important business and technology skills required within this increasingly complex business. Among the potential career opportunities are office managers in medical practices with three or more physicians; department assistant managers in hospitals; site administration at ambulatory care centers; and others.

## HEALTH SERVICES ADMINISTRATION (A.A.S.)

Berkeley College's two Health Services Administration programs allow students to specialize in key areas of healthcare. The curriculum is grounded in business administration and technology. The Health Services Administration - Medical Insurance, Billing, and Coding program is designed to develop abilities to collect, process, and use information essential to the industry and its clients.

## INFORMATION SYSTEMS MANAGEMENT (B.B.A., A.A.S.)

This program helps students develop an understanding of how successful businesses have streamlined their systems and reorganized their staffs so that vast amounts of information are exchanged more efficiently than ever. Curriculum focuses on business administration, while combining professional courses in management with courses on the Internet-related subjects applicable to the business world.

### **INTERIOR DESIGN (B.S., A.A.S.)**

These degree programs are designed to develop technical skill, creativity, and an understanding of all aspects of interior design that affect the health, safety, and welfare of the general public. Explore design fundamentals, theory, visual communication, basics in color, computer-aided design and drafting, textiles, model building and other exciting topics. The Interior Design Management Bachelor's program emphasizes business fundamentals, including accounting, marketing, and management, while preparing students for potential careers as project managers in construction, interior design, and architectural firms.

### **INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS (B.B.A., B.S., A.A.S. and A.S.)**

The International Business degree programs provide students with the knowledge and understanding to deal effectively with the complexities of contemporary global business environments, both multinational and multicultural. Learn creative problem-solving, team building, presentation techniques, and strategic planning. Career opportunities exist in advertising, banking, consulting, financial services, government, manufacturing, sales and transportation.

### **JUSTICE STUDIES – CRIMINAL JUSTICE (B.S., A.A.S.)**

The Bachelor's degree program in Justice Studies - Criminal Justice provides students a comprehensive foundation for a wide variety of careers in criminal justice. Students gain the technological and management skills required for successful careers in justice administration. The Associate's program provides a basic foundation to get students started. Career opportunities include policing, corrections, probation, private security, and criminal justice administration.

### **MANAGEMENT (B.B.A., B.S., A.A.S.)**

Berkeley College's Management degree programs foster innovation and creativity in decision-making and enable students to develop the skills necessary to actively participate in the management of a modern organization. Management positions are available in a wide variety of businesses.

### **MANAGEMENT - ENTREPRENEURSHIP (B.S.)**

Students who dream of running their own business or plan to take over a family business can benefit from Berkeley College's Management degree program with a concentration in Entrepreneurship. It provides invaluable insights on how others have spotted opportunities in the marketplace, capitalized on consumer needs, and built successful businesses. Courses emphasize the application of sound business principles in developing and evaluating ideas for start-up and expansion, preparing a business plan, and financing and managing a small business.

### **MANAGEMENT - ENVIRONMENTAL (B.S.)**

Companies recognize the impact of their business practices on the environment and are taking more and more steps to address sustainability in these areas such as manufacturing processes and materials, transportation, building operations and energy usage, food service, and finance. Berkeley College's Management degree program with a concentration in Environmental Management provides valuable insights into how businesses are affecting the environment and what organizations must do to operate successfully in an era of heightened environmental awareness.

### **MANAGEMENT - HUMAN RESOURCES (B.S.)**

Hiring the right people and effectively managing them is essential to the success of every major business and organization. Berkeley College's Management program with a concentration in Human Resources focuses on the complexities of this field so students gain a clear understanding of strategies for attracting and retaining a skilled, motivated workforce. The curriculum explores legal issues affecting employment policies as well as benefits administration and professional development.

### **MANAGEMENT - NONPROFIT (B.S.)**

Annual charitable giving in the United States exceeds \$300 billion. Managers who understand the subtle differences in managing a nonprofit versus a for-profit company are vital if these organizations are to thrive. Students are exposed to governance, marketing, finance, and

human resource challenges that are unique to the nonprofit sector.

### **MARKETING (B.B.A., B.S., A.A.S.)**

Every product and service requires people who know how to spot potential buyers and motivate them to make a purchase decision. Students who enjoy that kind of challenge will find the Berkeley College Marketing degree programs very rewarding. Learn about global competition, new product introductions, advertising, market research, and promotion. Career opportunities exist worldwide in advertising, product development, customer service, and public relations.

### **PARALEGAL STUDIES (A.A.S. and Certificate Program)**

Paralegals are qualified to perform law-related work under the supervision of a lawyer: analyze legal issues; investigate and evaluate facts; prepare pleadings, contracts, forms, legal memoranda, and other documents; interview clients; assist in case management; and perform other duties. The programs are approved by the American Bar Association (ABA).

### **Academic Certificate Programs**

Berkeley College's academic Certificate programs provide students with the opportunity to get a head start on a gratifying career in one year or less. Certificate programs in business include hands-on training in the latest software essential for today including spreadsheets, word processing, and more. All credits earned in the programs are transferable to Berkeley's degree programs and students gain all the benefits of a Berkeley education, including lifetime placement privileges and software refresher courses. Students can continue education and career development without any loss of time and take advantage of an employer tuition reimbursement plan.



# Berkeley College – Take the first step

Graduation from secondary school or its equivalent, and proof of English speaking ability are the basic requirements to attend Berkeley College.

## International students must submit the following:

- A completed international student application form
- A non-refundable \$50 application fee
- A \$300 tuition deposit
- A \$400 residence deposit (White Plains and Garret Mountain locations only)
- Official secondary or post-secondary transcripts of academic grades (translated into English) and proof of graduation
- Proof of English proficiency (or ESL certification or admission to an approved ESL program)
- Official document of financial support indicating a minimum of \$31,000 in available funds

English language proficiency can be demonstrated by successfully completing an English as a Second Language program at a recognized school or by the following methods:

- TOEFL Test – A score of 500 (PBT) or 173 (CBT) or a score of 61 (IBT)
- IELTS – A score of 5.0 or higher
- Michigan English Test – A score of 78 or better
- University of Cambridge-British Council – A grade no lower than a “C”
- APIEL – A grade 3 or higher
- English for Sweden – Grade VG
- TOEIC – A score of 800 or better
- STEP – A score of 2A or better

Decisions are made within two weeks after all application materials are received.

## Scholarships

International student scholarships are available. Scholarship applications must be received at the same time students apply for admission.

## Transferring Credits

Berkeley will accept transfer credits for courses in which the students earned a minimum grade of “C”, that are applicable to a student’s program at Berkeley. For a complete review of transfer credits, please submit your post-secondary transcript along with your application documents. All documents must be translated into English.

## Student Visas

To obtain a SEVIS I-20, students must satisfy Berkeley College’s and immigration officials’ requirement that sufficient finances

are available to pay for tuition and living expenses. A certified bank statement can verify this. Once accepted to Berkeley, the SEVIS I-20, which is needed to obtain a student visa, is sent to the applicant.

## English as a Second Language

English as a Second Language is offered at the New York City Campus. Students who are at a high-intermediate level of ESL have the advantage of taking an appropriate degree-level class along with their ESL classes. This gives students a head start on their Berkeley College degree.

## Conditional Acceptance

If a student wishes to enter one of Berkeley’s programs and does not have the required proof of English proficiency, he or she can apply for both ESL classes and admission to Berkeley College at the same time, using the international student application form. If all requirements are met, conditional acceptance into the academic program is granted based on successful completion of the ESL program.
