



you can count on a liberal arts foundation that will prepare you for countless worlds of opportunity, allowing you to hone critical thinking and communication skills that will serve you in any career.





FACULTY ACCOLADES

- Dr. Kenneth William Cook and Mr. Gary N. Kahaho'omalu Kanada co-authored a new Hawaiian grammar book based on analysis of more than 100 years of research into the Hawaiian language.

THE DOWNTOWN CAMPUS

Take a walk through HPU's downtown campus to encounter the rich mix of languages, cultures, and people that make Honolulu—Hawai'i's capital city—a microcosm of the global community. On the way to class you'll pass the offices of some of the Pacific Rim's most important companies, and likely the sites of future internships or even careers. The campus—set amidst the gleaming glass, bricks, steel, and palm trees of Hawai'i's capital—offers state-of-the-art multimedia classrooms, a new psychology lab, a computer lab, and wireless Internet access. Chinatown, Ala Moana Shopping Center and the boutiques, galleries and dining of Waikiki are only a short walk or bus ride away. While the downtown campus has no residence halls, HPU works with a local property management company that provides students with a variety of housing options in the Honolulu/Waikiki area.

What will you find at the Oceanic Institute?



THE FREAR TECHNOLOGY CENTER

Prepare for a 21st-century career in HPU's Frear Technology Center, the home of the College of Professional Studies and our undergraduate computer science program. The **Hardware Telecommunication Lab** allows students to learn computer and telecommunication system design through hands-on experience. Students explore logical modeling and software engineering in the **Software Engineering Lab**, and develop and test practical business systems in the **Information Systems Lab**. In the **HECO Lab**, business students use the center's powerful modeling software to create societal scenarios and test the economic impact of policy decisions. And in the **Video and Audio Labs**, students learn to create state-of-the-art multimedia projects using advanced editing equipment and even a soundproof recording studio.



LEARN WITH YOUR HEAD

HPU's size and dedicated professors allow learning to happen far beyond lectures and books. As a student at HPU, you will learn with your hands, your head and your heart through a world of opportunities that bring learning to life.

STUDENT RESEARCH

Student research can prepare you for the real world, allow you to get a jump-start on graduate school and help you decide what you want to do with your life. Unfortunately, many institutions are so full of graduate students, you're lucky if you can wash a test tube.

At HPU, small classes and a student-centered philosophy mean you can get the hands-on experience and essential research skills you need. Working side-by-side with professors, our students are:

- Researching plankton tows in Kane'ohe Bay on the *Kaholo*, HPU's research vessel
- Deepening their knowledge of forensic psychology through a study of jury selection
- Developing hands-on skills in nursing, education, and social work through clinical experiences and practicums
- Examining sustainable fishing using HPU's Acoustic Doppler Current Profiler
- Searching for new treatments for strokes in the cells of marine organisms



- Documenting the sinking of a Japanese midget attack submarine in the hours before the Pearl Harbor attack for a video broadcast on KFVE and at the *USS Arizona* Memorial at Pearl Harbor

- Developing a global knowledge of the medical arts at the Transcultural Nursing Center

- Attending a master class with the Honolulu Brass from the Honolulu Symphony
- Learning to work with and counsel your fellow students as part of the psychology department's Peer Support Program

HPU'S FLOATING LABORATORY


Students in marine science, biology or environmental science can gain field and research experience aboard the *Kaholo*, HPU's 45-foot, double-hulled research boat. A \$75,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Education is allowing HPU students to collect and assess data in

Kane'ohe Bay, a long-term project that will provide benchmarks for changes in the bay's chemistry, water temperature, and marine plant life.

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When we say you'll go in-depth at HPU, we mean it. Students working side-by-side with professors dove up to 5,000 feet below the surface to investigate environmental conditions of submarine canyons using a Pisces V submarine. Dr. Eric Vetter works with student Brandi Kivi (shown above with the Pisces V submarine). Data from the research contribute to understanding of how biodiversity is created and maintained, and the impact of canyons on near-shore fisheries and their role in marine conservation.


A STUDENT-CENTERED INSTITUTION

Reputation Outstanding. A private, not-for-profit, coeducational, nonsectarian, career-oriented postsecondary institution founded in 1965, HPU is consistently ranked among the best educational institutions in the nation. It is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC), Inc. The Bachelor of Social Work program is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). The University is a member of the International Association for Management Education (AACSB), recognized by the Hawai'i Commission of Postsecondary Education, and approved by the Hawai'i Board of Nursing.
