TRANSPORT IS CHEAP & EASY

Wollongong is close to Sydney – just 90 minutes by road or train. Once you arrive here, your transport options around the city are safe, easy and cheap.

-  **FREE BUSES**
Wollongong is well-connected with buses going to all of the surrounding suburbs.

Free 'city loop' buses run all day and into the night, making it easy for you to travel from campus and student accommodation to the city centre, train station and shopping district.
-  **TRAIN**
North Wollongong Station is a 15-minute walk or a short free shuttle bus ride from our Wollongong campus.
-  **BICYCLE**
UOW has end of trip facilities including showers, change rooms, and secure bike lock up. Bike racks are also conveniently placed outside buildings across campus.
-  **WALK**
Most destinations in Wollongong are an easy walk away.
-  **CAR**
UOW runs a carpooling program, so if you have two or more friends in your car, you get free parking on campus.

 **COST**
For any public transport in and between Wollongong and Sydney, you'll never pay more than \$16.10 a day or \$50 a week. Travel on Sundays is \$2.80.¹



COUNSELLING SERVICES

STUDENT SUPPORT ADVISERS

These advisers provide support and referral services to UOW students. They also provide programs supporting student equity and diversity both within faculties and across campus. They assist you with a range of issues such as orientation to the local area, study difficulties, academic concerns, budgeting, homesickness, legal issues and accidents, student visas, health and personal problems, family emergencies, and children's education. The service is free and confidential.

UOW SECURITY SERVICE

The Security Service helps provide a safe and secure campus environment with trained and licensed security officers providing emergency response, first aid, after-dark escorts and patrols. They operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week.






CAMPUS EAST ^{CE}




Study options

Choosing your program

Study Abroad and Exchange programs are designed for international undergraduate or postgraduate students who wish to spend one or two semesters in a program of study at the University of Wollongong and transfer the credits to their home institution. For application procedure information see page 31.

STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

The Study Abroad program is designed to welcome students to UOW from both formally recognised study abroad partners and non-affiliated institutions for one or two semesters.

Study Abroad students pay tuition fees directly to UOW for their program of study at UOW.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The University of Wollongong has established formal exchange agreements with a number of leading universities worldwide. This program allows a limited number of students to study at UOW for one or two semesters. Exchange students are not required to pay tuition fees to UOW. Refer to the list of exchange partners on pages 32-33, and contact your home university for more information.

BUSINESS INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Business Internship program is designed to offer students undertaking any business or commerce degree with the opportunity to add a Work Integrated Learning Experience to their study. The COMM391 subject supports the program with the required theory and concepts to enhance what is learned during the internship. To be admitted into this program, students are required to go through a competitive recruitment process, including a written application, video and Skype interviews with potential employers. Students interested in applying for the program will need to advise the Office of Global Student Mobility in advance. Only if the timing of submission is in accordance with the specific program recruitment times will applications be considered. Successful students are required to enrol in at least one other subject from the Faculty of Business and Law along with COMM391, and one or two other UOW subjects to make up a full-time study load. VISITING RESEARCH PROGRAM

The Visiting Research Program is designed for students undertaking research at either an undergraduate or postgraduate level who are currently enrolled full-time at an overseas university and wish to obtain research experience with a UOW research team. This program is usually between three and six months in duration and must be a formal requirement for the degree at the student's home university. Securing a UOW academic supervisor is the responsibility of the applicant. Participants must contact the relevant UOW faculty or school to gain the support of a member of UOW academic staff to supervise their project.

Choosing your subjects

Subjects are taught as a mix of lectures, tutorials or seminars, laboratory work where appropriate, and individual study. Study Abroad and Exchange students are assessed in the same way as Australian students.

PLANNING A PROGRAM OF STUDY

Study Abroad and Exchange students enrol for one or two sessions as a non-award student at UOW. The year is broken into semesters, with UOW taking enrolments in Session 1 (February) or Session 2 (July).

If you are studying a postgraduate business program through UOW Sydney Business School, either in Sydney or Wollongong, your sessions are trimesters and start in February, May and August.

As part of your application to study at UOW, you will be required to submit a Study Plan. This is a list of proposed UOW subjects that will be assessed based on your academic background prior to your arrival. Every effort will be made to obtain approval of your selected subjects, however this is not guaranteed. You'll need to be flexible with your subject selection, and be prepared with additional subject choices. Academic advice on your study program is available from UOW staff during orientation week. We advise that you bring a current transcript of your academic record from your home university or college, as well as subject outlines and descriptions. It is your responsibility to ensure that the proposed program will earn the credits needed to satisfy the degree requirements of your home university or college.

CHOOSING SUBJECTS

The subject information in this prospectus should be used as a guide only. For further information on subjects, please visit uow.info/solss/subjects

You can choose by the subject codes on pages 21–29, or by entering part of a subject name.

Undergraduate students choose subject codes between 100–400 (i.e. 1st – 4th year subjects).

Postgraduate students choose subject codes between 800–900.

You can study postgraduate subjects if you have completed the recognised equivalent of undergraduate studies at your home institution.

Check for prerequisites as some subjects require that you have taken an equivalent subject or number of credits from your home university.

To give yourself some flexibility with timetabling during enrolment, you should obtain approval in advance for five or six subjects per session.

SUBJECT AVAILABILITY

When choosing subjects, note that many subjects at the Wollongong campus are ONLY offered in either Session 1 (February) or Session 2 (July).

Postgraduate business subjects are offered by UOW's Sydney Business School at the Wollongong and Sydney campuses on a trimester system. Trimesters begin in February, May, and August. Students enrol in three subjects (18 credit points) per trimester. Students must decide whether they wish to study at the Wollongong or Sydney campus, and only select subjects available at that campus. Students cannot select subjects in a Wollongong or Sydney-based program that includes both trimesters and semesters.

ASSESSMENT

The assessment details for each subject can be found in the Subject Database at uow.info/solss/subjects

A comprehensive syllabus outlining assessments and other expectations is provided to students in the first lecture of each subject.

The transfer of grades to your home university varies for each home college or institution.

WORKLOAD

To meet the requirements of a student visa, Study Abroad and Exchange students must enroll in a minimum of 18 credit points and a maximum of 32 credit points per semester. Postgraduate business students must enroll in a maximum of three subjects per trimester.

In determining your individual program, you should note that:

- subjects are offered on a credit point basis
- a normal full-time course load is 48 credit points over two sessions, or 24 credit points for one session (in either February or July session), or 12 credit points in Summer session.

One credit point has an implied workload of two hours per week. Six credit points represents a minimum of 12 hours of work: this may be three hours of lectures, four hours of reading and five hours of personal study or essay writing. Many full-time students will spend fewer than 15 hours a week in contact with lecturers or tutors but will be expected to prepare for these classes with reading and tutorial preparation.

Australian universities require students to be self-directed in their study and to submit a considerable amount of written work in assignments and seminar or tutorial papers.

TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts of your UOW subject results are issued by UOW at the end of each session, and provide details of the subjects completed and final mark and grade awarded. Transcripts will be issued either digitally via My eEquals or in hardcopy depending on the arrangement with your home university.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAMS

ENGLISH FOR ENTRY TO UOW

Students who do not meet the direct entry requirements for Study Abroad and Exchange may choose to enrol in a period of intensive English through UOW College (located on the Wollongong campus). Courses are offered for 6, 12 or 18 weeks with the option of adding additional weeks of study depending on your level of English. English classes commence every six weeks.

ENGLISH PLUS UNI

Offered through UOW College, English Plus Uni is for students who do not have English as their first language, and have not met the required level of English to undertake a formal semester program.

Students audit one or two university subjects and, at the same time, take part-time English language classes. Students study English for 14 hours per week and attend their chosen university subject(s) for 3–6 hours per week.

Students receive a transcript from UOW College for their studies. Home universities may choose to offer credit for this program.

STUDY TOURS AND GROUP PROGRAMS
