## Application for admission as an international student

### What you need to know before applying for admission

- We recommend that you familiarise yourself with the details of the programme you are interested in BEFORE you apply for admission. Check that the programme and the courses offered by the relevant academic department will meet your academic objectives. Please view the relevant department/programme website for further information.
- Many graduate and postgraduate programmes have specific application requirements and/or an additional application process. These programmes include (but are not limited to): Postgraduate Certificate in Antarctic Studies, Graduate Diploma in Business Administration, graduate diplomas in Teaching and Learning, postgraduate diplomas in Business Management, Child and Family Psychology, Clinical Psychology, Health Sciences, Industrial and Organisational Psychology, Social Work, Master of Audiology, Master of Business Administration (MBA), Master of Business Management (MBM), Master of Education, Master of Education with Certificate in Counselling, Master of Engineering in Management (MEM), Master of Engineering in Fire Engineering, Master of Health Sciences, Master of Social Work (Applied), Master of Science in Applied Psychology and Master of Speech and Language Therapy. Please check the academic department website or enquire through the International Office.

### Important notes

- Please PRINT CLEARLY. To ensure that your application is processed efficiently and to ensure that we can contact you, it is essential that we can accurately interpret the information you supply, particularly your name, email and postal address details. All sections must be completed.
- Incomplete applications cannot be processed. Ensure you provide all required documentation – please note:
  - All transcripts and degree certificates for university level study undertaken must be included.
  - All academic documents must be originals, or certified/notarised true copies. Faxed, scanned or emailed documents will not be accepted as original or certified/notarised copies.

A certified/notarised true copy is a photocopy of the original document signed and verified as a genuine, unaltered copy. Suitable people to certify documents include a solicitor, a Justice of the Peace, a notary public or an official of the institution that issued the original document. The copy must bear the official stamp of that person or institution.

- You should apply as early as possible to give yourself maximum preparation time for visa, fee payment, travel and accommodation arrangements.
- Where possible postgraduate applicants should apply at least 6 months before their intended start date. Late applications will be processed, but we cannot guarantee that a decision will be made in time for you to make the necessary arrangements to start your studies here.

### College of Education applicants please note:

This form can be used for honours programmes in Teaching and Learning and postgraduate programmes in Education.

This form is NOT for undergraduate degrees in Teaching and Learning, graduate diplomas in Teaching and Learning or Sport Coaching programmes.
